

Course Information

This qualification reflects the role of workers participating in the design, implementation and evaluation of leisure, health activities and programs for clients in one or more sector areas. Workers may be in residential facilities and/or in community agencies and day centres, completing specialised tasks and functions in relation to leisure and health. While workers are responsible for their own outputs, work is carried out under direct or indirect supervision within defined organisation guidelines.

Workers may be required to demonstrate leadership and have limited responsibility for the organisation in terms of the quantity and quality of outputs of others within narrow parameters.

Entry Requirements

The target learners for this course must:

- Be over 15 years of age and no longer attending secondary school
- Obtain a security clearance*
- Undertake a Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) Skills Indicator
- Ability to undertake vocational placement, which includes manual handling
- Have technological skills to undertake computer/online work and have access to a computer and software with the following minimum specifications

Enrolment Requirements

To enrol in this course, you must provide -

- Proof of ID: Colour copy of Passport or Driver's Licence.
- Unique Student Identification Number (USI)
- Colour copy of Certificates and Statement Results for any previously attained or partially completed qualifications completed in or recognised in Australia.

Vocational Placement

All students will be required to complete either a Vocational placement Log Book or, if an Existing worker, a Workplace log book of at least 120 hours of direct care within an approved community service setting. DP Training has a partnership with leading community service providers with whom we will coordinate your placement. For those who do not wish to attend DP Training's selected placement, you will have the opportunity to source your own alternative vocational work placement location in coordination with DP Training.

It is a requirement to obtain security clearance* before you can commence your placement. If you already have a security clearance* please provide a copy with your enrolment. If not, you will need to apply for one upon course commencement.


