Vocational Placement

Certificate III in Individual Support (Ageing and Disability):

Minimum 120 hours of vocational placement required at a relevant workplace.

Diploma of Community Services:

Minimum 200 hours of vocational placement required at a relevant workplace.

Placement may be voluntary work or paid employment in a relevant role.

Security Clearances: Some qualifications require a security clearance (e.g., police check, valid blue card and/or yellow card) in order for the student to be eligible to undertake practical and/or vocational placement. Additionally, individual host organisations may have different requirements regarding vaccinations. Please discuss these with our Administration Team during the enrolment process and/or refer to the DP Training website for more information. Please note there are mandatory vaccination requirements within each state and it is up to the student to ensure they are complying with their own state, territory legislation and workplace organisation policies and procedures.
